

- Public outreach




KEY ELEMENTS OF AB 617

- 3. CARB may select communities based on South Coast AQMD's recommendation






AB 617 DESIGNATED COMMUNITIES IN SOUTH COAST AQMD






School Air Filtration Program

School Air Filtration Program

Children are especially sensitive to air pollution compared to the general population. To reduce children's exposure to particulate pollution, South Coast AQMD has funded installation and maintenance of air filtration systems in 95 schools and Early Education Centers (EECs) in disadvantaged and low-income communities since 2008. These systems, including panel filters and standalone units, reduce the levels of indoor particulate matter children breathe throughout the day. Schools where air filtration has been installed with funding from South Coast AQMD are shown on this map.


South Coast AQMD offers two dynamic programs designed to build on the agency's long history of K-12 educational outreach to teachers and students in the region, especially within environmental justice communities.
