- ls **organized and engaged** around air pollution issues
- Demonstrates experience and willingness to work with government agencies, organizations, business or business organizations, schools, hospitals, etc.
- Demonstrates progress with science-based community air pollution projects, such as community air sensors projects or community plan development



### 2019-2020 Timeline

Feb-Jun 2019 - Outreach Meetings

June 30, 2019 – Deadline for communities to submit nominations

**September 2019** – South Coast AQMD Board considers Year 2 recommendations

**December 2019** – California Air Resources Board considers Year 2 communities

**2020** – Year 2 Community Steering Committees formed and begin to meet
