# Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The purpose of the proposed amendments is to incorporate by reference federal New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) into SCAQMD Regulation IX. Specifically, this action incorporates Subparts A and F— General Provisions, and New Source Performance Standards for Portland Cement Plants (U.S. EPA effective date November 8, 2010, Reference: 75 FR54970, Vol. 75, No. 174, September 9, 2010) which contain: 1) additional or revised emission limits for particulate matter (PM), opacity, nitrogen dioxide (NO2), and sulfur dioxide (SO2) for facilities that commenced construction, modification, or reconstruction after June 16, 2008; and, 2) additional testing and monitoring requirements for affected sources. The incorporation by reference of NSPS requirements into Regulation IX recognizes the SCAQMD's authority to implement and enforce these federal regulations at the local level.
