I. CLOSURE STATUS AND PROCEDURAL UPDATE

As reported in Exide's April 2015 Status Update, on March 27, 2015, the bankruptcy court approved Exide's motion to close the Vernon facility and confirmed Exide's plan for reorganization. On April 7, 2015, Exide gave written notice to various agencies, including AQMD, of its intent to close the facility. Exide emerged from Chapter 11 bankruptcy on April 30, 2015.

Exide and AQMD have discussed the closure process and its impact on the Hearing Board's orders for abatement. Pursuant to those discussions, Exide is filing a Petition to Modify Order for Abatement 3151-29. Exide, with AQMD concurrence, seeks to terminate Order 3151-29 on the grounds that Exide is closing the facility and thus will not complete installation of the risk reduction projects. Exide has reserved a hearing date of June 2, 2015. Exide and AQMD have mutually agreed to maintain Order for Abatement 3151-32 in place for now, pending further communication.

II. SUMMARY OF WORK UNDER ORDER FOR ABATEMENT 3151-32

Although Exide did not work on the risk reduction projects during this Update Period, Exide performed a variety of maintenance and other tasks, such as: (i) soil and groundwater sampling, (ii) removing and shipping feed material, (iii) manhole repairs, and (iv) dust removal inside enclosures.

AQMD issued Exide an NOV on May 1, 2015 as a result of notes in Tetra-Tech's weekly status report number 29 about March 27 sampling work by an Exide subcontractor performing concrete coring. Tetra-Tech's report stated "water was observed flowing out of the temporary enclosure maintained under negative pressure onto the pavement in the North Yard", the alleged release of water constituted a "deviation" from an approved mitigation plan, and Exide is investigating the incident. Tetra-Tech's report also indicated that "Dust Trak monitoring did not
